

Privacy Policy

The Scottish Korfball Association is the National Governing Body for the sport of korfball in Scotland, and is affiliated to the [International Korfball Federation](#). This privacy policy will explain how our organization uses any personal data we collect from you when you use our website or apply to become one of our members.

What data do we collect?

The Scottish Korfball Association collects the following data:

- Personal identification information (name, email address, phone number, etc.)
- Standard Internet log information and visitor behavior information (IP addresses, device information, page-clicks on our own web-sites, etc.)

How do we collect your data?

You provide the Scottish Korfball Association with the data we collect both directly and indirectly.

We collect data and process data when you:

- Register online

- Voluntarily complete a membership/customer survey or provide feedback on any of our message boards or via email
- Use or view our website via your browser's cookies

The Scottish Korfball Association may also receive your data indirectly from the following sources:

- The individual korfball clubs that make up the Association (its club members).

How will we use your data?

The Scottish Korfball Association collects your data so that we can:

- Maintain a register of our members
- Email you with information about products, events and services that we think are important for you to know about

How do we store your data?

The Scottish Korfball Association securely stores your data in US-based online platforms such as MailChimp and Google and on UK-based platforms such as our web-site hosting provider, Fasthosts. We use password-protected databases to store the data; these are accessible only by the elected office-bearers of the SKA Management Committee.

The Scottish Korfball Association will keep your personal information and contact details for a period of up to 10 years. Once this time period has expired, we will delete your data from our database(s) manually.

Marketing & Communications

The Scottish Korfball Association would like to send you information about products, events and services of our own that we think are important for you to know about, as well as those of related organizations including:

- The International Korfball Federation
- Other National Governing Bodies (e.g. the English Korfball Association)
- Other agencies and statutory bodies (e.g. Sport Scotland, Disclosure Scotland)

If you have agreed to receive our marketing and communications, you may always opt out at a later date.

You have the right at any time to stop the Scottish Korfball Association from contacting you for marketing and communication purposes, or giving your data to other members of our group.

What are your data protection rights?

The Scottish Korfball Association would like to make sure you are fully aware of all of your data protection rights. Every user is entitled to the following:

The right to access – You have the right to request the Scottish Korfball Association for copies of your personal data. We may charge you a small fee for this service.

The right to rectification – You have the right to request that the Scottish Korfball Association correct any information you believe is inaccurate. You also have the right to request the Scottish Korfball Association to complete the information you believe is incomplete.

The right to erasure – You have the right to request that The Scottish Korfball Association erase your personal data, under certain conditions.

The right to restrict processing – You have the right to request that the Scottish Korfball Association restrict the processing of your personal data, under certain conditions.

The right to object to processing – You have the right to object to the Scottish Korfball Association's processing of your personal data, under certain conditions.

The right to data portability – You have the right to request that the Scottish Korfball Association transfer the data that we have collected to another organization, or directly to you, under certain conditions.

Cookies

Cookies are text files placed on your computer to collect standard Internet log information and visitor behavior information. When you visit our websites, we may collect information from you automatically through cookies or similar technology

How do we use cookies?

The Scottish Korfball Association uses cookies in a range of ways to improve your experience on our website, including:

- Keeping you signed in
- Understanding how you use our website

What types of cookies do we use?

There are a number of different types of cookies, however, our website uses:

- **Functionality** – The Scottish Korfball Association uses these cookies so that we recognize you on our website and remember your previously selected preferences. These could include what language you prefer and location you are in. A mix of first-party and third-party cookies is used.

- Marketing & Communications – The Scottish Korfball Association uses these cookies to collect information about your visit to our website, the content you viewed, the links you followed and information about your browser, device, and your IP address. This information allows us to optimize how we arrange our website and newsletters, etc. A mix of first-party and third-party cookies is used.

How to manage cookies

You can set your browser not to accept cookies, and the above website tells you how to remove cookies from your browser. However, in a few cases, some of our website features may not function as a result.

Privacy policies of other websites

The Scottish Korfball Association website contains links to other websites. Our privacy policy applies only to our website, so if you click on a link to another website, you should read their privacy policy.
